



Update - Tibberton & Cherrington Parish Council Meeting, 21st March 2019

Successes – The last two Parish Magazine articles have provided advice on how to avoid scam calls and tenancy deposit scheme fraud. The police attended the Village Hall site again in February. Thanks to John Major for giving us both access to the Parish Council website to enable us to add updates and reports. Several items will be added in the coming week.

We Don't Buy Crime / SmartWater – We've had a few more positive responses and the Parish Council is looking at possible sponsorship options for funding the initial purchase of the kits. Once that outcome is known the Parish Council and Neighbourhood Watch will resume discussions with SmartWater and West Mercia Police on the next steps outlined to the last Parish Council meeting. At present Shropshire Homes have offered £100 only, but the PC is looking at this again.

Neighbourhood Watch Signs – The order for the 8 signs - 4 Tibberton and 4 Cherrington – should be delivered in April. There is space on the signs to say who has funded them and, while 4 are being provided by the Police and Crime Commissioner Funding, there is space centrally at the foot of them on them to add something about them being "Funded by Our Parish", or words to that effect. Once we have the new signs then all the existing signage will be replaced ASAP in the Spring.
